

Fall 2009 Enrollment Report

A monitoring report for:

**GRCC Board of Trustees
October 19, 2009**

Highlights

Over 1,500 more students enrolled at GRCC this fall, with the headcount rising 10.1 percent from last fall. Contact hours increased 12.0 percent and credit hours increased by 11.9 percent; lecture sections totaled 2,140, up from 1,927 last fall and 1,435 in Fall 1999 (a 49% increase). The market share of GRCC students compared to the Kent County workforce increased to 41.8 per 1000 this year, up 10.9 since the Fall of 2004 when it was 30.9. The number of students transferring in from other colleges was 969, up from 693 in 2008. Demographic data showed marked increases in the percentage of minority populations (currently at 23.9%) and in the percentage of students 25 years of age and older (now at 33.5%).

Key Findings

Headcount

- The headcount for Fall 2009 was 16,992, up 10.1 percent from last fall. (Table 1)

Contact and Credit Hours

- Contact hours for Fall 2009 totaled 183,989, up 12.0 percent from last fall. (Table 2)
- Credit hours for Fall 2009 totaled 161,216, up 11.9 percent from last fall. This was the largest Fall credit hour count ever. (Table 3)

Workforce Development/Arts and Sciences Contact Hours

- Arts and Sciences contact hours increased 14.0 percent and Workforce Development contact hours increased 6.6 percent. (Table 5)
- The Arts and Sciences departments with the largest percentage increase in contact hours were: Wellness at +20.2 percent, English at +22.2 percent, and Biological Sciences at +21.2 percent. Contact hour gains were seen in all 11 departments. (Table 7)
- The Workforce Development programs with the largest percentage increase in contact hours include: Automotive at +23.0 percent, Computer Applications at +19.0 percent, and Applied Technology at +16.8 percent. Contact hour gains were seen in 10 of the 12 departments. (Table 7)

Total Number of Lecture Sections/Average Number of Students Per Section

- The total number of lecture sections offered for Fall 2009 was 2,140. The average number of students per section was 24.7, up slightly from 24.4 in Fall 2008. (Table 9)

Residency

- The proportion of resident students was 76.1 percent while in-state non-resident students was 23.3 percent and out-of-state students was 0.6 percent. (Table 10)

Kent County Market Share

- 41.8 of every 1000 Kent county working adults attend GRCC this Fall semester. This number was up from 35.1 per 1000 last year and from 30.9 per 1000 in Fall 2004. (Table 11)

Persistence Rates

- One-year persistence rates for beginning, degree-seeking freshman from Fall 2008 returning for Fall 2009 was 57.4 percent, down from last year's 59.8 percent. (Table 12)

Credits by Location and Time

- The number of credits taken on the main campus comprise 138,293, 85.8 percent of the total. Lakeshore campus credits totaled 6,924, over 4% of all credits. (Table 13)

Enrollment by Student Type

- 47.3 percent of all Fall 2009 students attended GRCC in Winter 2009. 15.9 percent attended GRCC in past terms but not last winter (Occasional students). Spring 2009 high school graduates comprised 12.6 percent of the total. New transfer students totaled 5.7 percent. All other students made up 18.5 percent of the total. (Table 14)

Gender

- Female students comprise 51.6 percent of the total fall population. (Table 15)

Age

- 33.5 percent of Fall 2009 students were age 25 or older, up from 31.2 percent last year. The average age of students was 25.3 years. (Tables 16 and 17)

Ethnicity

- The percentage of total students from minority populations has increased to 23.9 percent, up from 21.2 percent in Fall 2008. The largest increases were seen in the African-American population, with over 500 more students enrolling. (Table 18)

Fulltime Students/Fulltime Equivalency

- The proportion of students who attend GRCC full time for Fall 2009 was 45.0 percent, up slightly from 43.8 percent. (Table 19)
- The average FTE (Full-Time Equivalent) for Fall 2009 was 10,401, a new record. The average number of credits enrolled was 9.5, up from 9.3 in Fall 2008. (Table 20)

Early College

- The number of early college students was 258 for Fall 2009, down from 287 last year. (Table 21)

New High School Graduates

- Among all students, the percent of Spring 2009 high school graduates was 12.6 percent. The total of 2,144 students was down slightly from the 2,272 students in 2008. (Table 22)

Training Solutions, Job Training, and Non-Credit Apprenticeships

- Training Solutions show a 23.4 percent increase compared with the previous year; Job Training enrollments were up 18.9 percent. (Table 23)
- A total of 29,430 students were served at GRCC during the 2008-2009 year, up from last year's 28,017. (Chart 1)

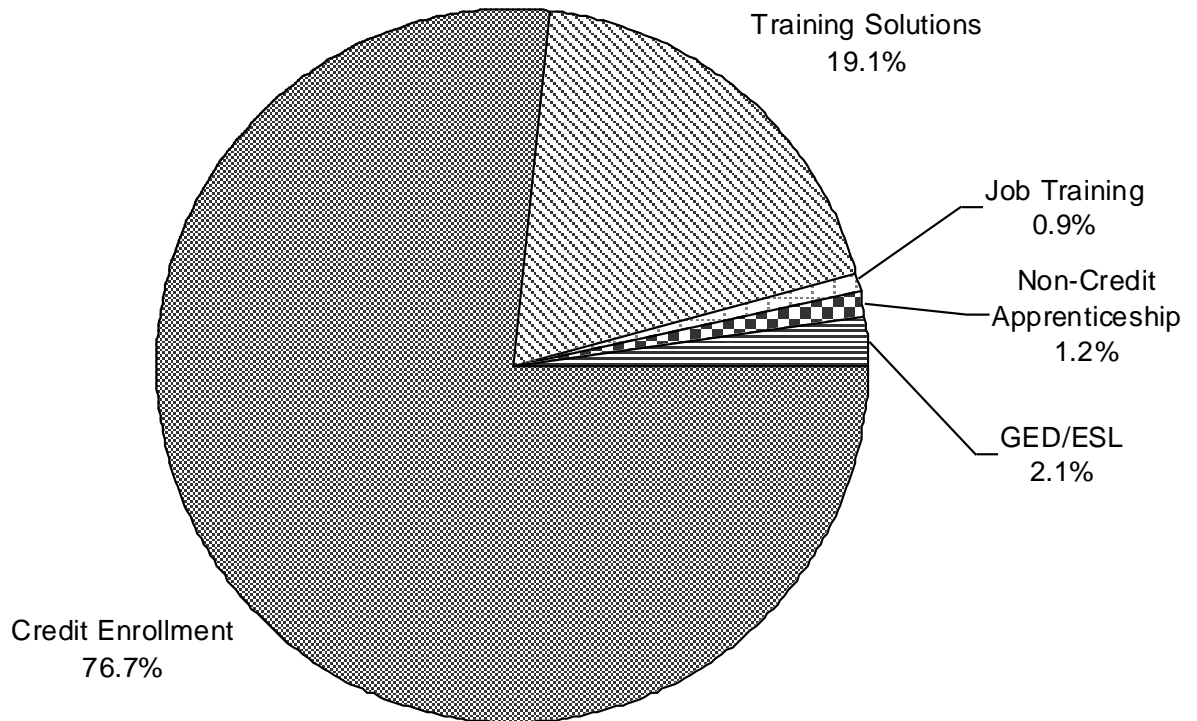
