



Analysis: Overall, results related to student perceptions of curriculum and curriculum delivery are remaining constant when compared to GRCC baseline data. The highest ratings are given by African American students and female students. The lowest ratings are given by male students.



### **Indicators of Success**

#### **Indicator 2:** Course success rates for selected gateway courses



Indicator: Success rates for the top ten enrolled college-level courses for fall semesters. This chart shows the percentage of students who successfully complete a course with a grade of C- or higher. Please note: the top 10 college-level enrolled courses vary slightly from year to year.

Status: 2020 Target – 72%. Normal range, 70-72%, Action required: Less than 71%.

Next Update: Fall 2020

Analysis: Fall 2018 All Courses Success Rate remained the same (76%) as for Fall 2017, while the Top 10 Courses Fall 2018 Success Rate declined slightly from the 3-year baseline of 72%, and each of the individual years included in the 3-year baseline. Females have higher course success rates than males. Students 25 years and older have higher success rates than students under 25. Students who do not receive Pell grants have higher course success rates than those who receive Pell grants. White students have higher course success rates than Hispanic and African American students.
