Know the Rules

It is crucial for faculty and students to be well versed on the Student Code of Conduct and other College policies to be successful. You may find the Student Code of Conduct online using this QR code.



Set Clear Guidelines

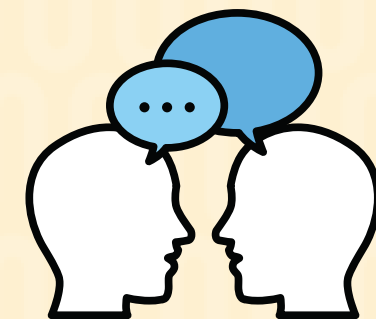
Faculty should set clear guidelines for engagement in your syllabus.

Students are expected to read, understand, and abide by the guidelines set by faculty. If questions arise, don't hesitate to ask your professor for clarification.

Respectfully Address It

If guidelines are not upheld, faculty have the right to address the behavior with the student privately and state the changes that should be made.

Students are expected to ensure no future issues arise.



Report to Student Conduct

Usually, students have the opportunity to improve their behavior once they are aware of the concern. If this is not the case, faculty may report the student to the Student Conduct office for a hearing.



Classroom Expectations

Students must know and respect the Student Code of Conduct rules about classroom behavior.

Examples of issues reported by faculty include:

- Disruptive behavior (i.e. being late, phone use, talking over others)
- AI usage on assignments
- Cheating/Plagiarism
