

2018 – 2019 Dental Assisting Program Outcomes (Program Goals)

1. Twenty-four new full time and six part time students will begin the program annually.
2. Maintain an admissions process, progression policy and student success plan (remediation plan) that ensure students are prepared to enter and complete the rigorous curriculum of dental assisting.
3. At least twenty-one students will graduate from the program each year.
4. Prepare graduates to perform entry level dental assisting skills that support comprehensive dental care to a diverse population as delegable to Michigan Registered Dental Assistants. Ninety-four percent of graduates will pass all licensure examinations by the second attempt.
5. Complete graduate surveys for class of 2017 and 2018.
6. Complete employer surveys for class of 2017 and 2018.
7. Develop new courses for DAA131, DAA132 and DAA133 face-to-face and Online.
8. Encourage an environment that promotes sustainability in the classroom, laboratory and clinical setting where qualified competent faculty teach and facilitate learning.
9. Sustain a dynamic dental assisting program that promotes contemporary, evidence based dental assisting practices.
10. Promote lifelong learning opportunities in professional organizations and community service.
